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To whom it may concern:

This letter is in support of the religious master Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh. I am a disciple of Bhagwan and took sanyas in November 1982, 18 months after he had entered into silence.

Bhagwan's silence is really a reminder to me of what he has been saying publicly for 20 years. That to be truly in communion with God or Life or the whole or whatever we may call it I must be utterly silent inside as well as outside. This in essence has been the teaching of many great masters before Bhagwan also.

I attended the Rajneesh festival this year in Rajneeshpuram Oregon, and in this time I experienced 7 days of Sahaj which is sitting in silence in the presence of Bhagwan in a heart to heart communion. I found this experience to be the most powerful "religious" experience of my life so far. I cannot explain it to you in words and if I am honest with myself I can see that many of the most beautiful experiences in my life can not be communicated by words.

Bhagwan's silence is a constant reminder of this fact and has encouraged me to be more and more silent and more and more open to God + Life itself. It is my feeling that Bhagwan's silence enhances his religious message rather than hinders it.
